- ARCHERY HUNTERS: ARRIVE THE DAY BEFORE YOUR HUNT STARTS IN THE AFTERNOON AND DEPART THE MORNING AFTER THE HUNT ENDS. MOST HUNTS ARE 5 DAY HUNTS, LODGE ADDRESSES ARE BELOW WE MEET IN THE TOWN OF NEW CASTLE FOR HIGH COUNTRY HUNTERS.
- ➤ BE PRACTICED UP ON ARCHERY SHOTS FROM MANY DIFFERENT SHOOTING POSITIONS AND ANGLES FROM 20-60 YARDS FOR THE BEST CHANCE AT BAGGING YOUR TROPHY. THERE WILL BE TARGETS IN CAMP FOR PRACTICE-BRING ARROWS YOU ARE USED TO USING WE RECOMMEND FIXED BLADES!!!
  - We recommend reading Craig Boddington's "The Perfect Shot, North America" for tips on shot placement.
- > ALL HUNTERS: COLORADO HAS VERY UNPREDICTABLE WEATHER IN THE FALL. IT COULD BE 60 DEGREES DURING THE DAY AND BELOW 10 DEGREES IN THE MORNING DURING RIFLE SEASON AND 90 IN THE DAY AND 30 IN THE MORNING DURING ARCHERY. DRESSING IN LAYERS (LONG UNDERWEAR) IS THE BEST WAY TO COMBAT THE COLD. YOU CAN'T GO WRONG WITH WOOL CLOTHING IN THE LATER SEASONS.



- For ALL of you hunting this year, we do recommend that you DRIVE OUT, shipping costs are extremely high and we have found that hunters find it easier and more economical to drive and take home their meat and heads on their own.
- This is just a suggested gear list and none of the clothing or gear is required with exception to orange hat and vest during rifle and muzzle loader seasons.

High Country Hunters!! ARCHERY AND RIFLE HUNTERS	

- Tree Stand Harnesses are recommended for HIGH COUNTRY archery and rifle hunters!!!
- It is best to pack your gear in 2 large sized duffel bags, things are easier to pack this way.
- Gaiters for your boots are handy to have in the High Country.
- > IT CAN BE MUCH COOLER AND HARSHER WEATHER IN THE HIGH COUNTRY THAN LOWER ELEVATIONS! PLEASE BE PREPARED! WOOL IS WARM EVEN WHEN WET! NO COTTON RECOMENDED!
- THOSE HUNTING AT THE HIGH-COUNTRY HORSEBACK HUNT WILL NEED TO BRING WARM SLEEPING BAG/PILLOW AND TOWELS/WASH CLOTH. A small water purifier can come in handy.
- ➤ BE PREPARED TO PACK IN BETWEEN NOON AND 2 PM THE DAY BEFORE YOUR HUNT STARTS, THE EXACT TIME WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE GUIDES 2 DAYS PRIOR TO THE HUNT, WE USUALLY MEET IN THE TOWN OF NEW CASTLE, UNLESS MEETING IN RIFLE TO GO TO SHOOTING RANGE.



# \*TRIPLE J RANCH, STARBUCK LODGE and NORTH CAMP RIFLE HUNTERS:

ALL RIFLE HUNTERS: PLEASE ARRIVE AROUND 2PM AT THE WALMART IN RIFLE, CO
THE DAY BEFORE YOUR HUNT STARTS. (UNLESS FLYING OR IF WE HAVE MADE PRIOR
ARRANGEMENTS) WE WILL THEN GO TO THE LOCAL SHOOTING RANGE AND MAKE SURE
THE ELEVATION AND/OR TRAVEL HASN'T EFFECTED YOUR RIFLE.

\*YOU WILL DEPART THE MORNING AFTER THE HUNT. MOST HUNTS ARE 5 DAY HUNTS.

\*\*\*THE TRIPLE J RANCH, STARBUCK LODGE AND NORTH CAMP LODGE ARE COMPLETELY OUTFITTED WITH ALL BEDDING, LINENS AND TOWELS.

- ➤ RIFLE HUNTERS MAY WANT SHOOTING STICKS (WE RECOMMEND PRIMOS tri-pod TRIGGER STICKS) AND NEED TO BE PRACTICED UP AT SHOOTING FROM DIFFERENT POSITIONS (INCLUDING FROM THE SHOOTING STICKS) FROM 200-400 YARDS FOR THE BEST CHANCE AT BAGGING YOUR TROPHY ALSO BE FAMILIAR WITH YOUR BULLETS AND BRING EXTRAS
- We recommend reading Craig Boddington's "The Perfect Shot, North America" for tips on shot placement.
- > BRING YOUR COLORADO HUNTING LICENSE (UNLESS YOU ARE PURCHASING LICENSE WHEN YOU GET HERE)
- > ALL HUNTERS: BRING YOUR HUNTERS SAFETY CARD UNLESS YOU WERE BORN BEFORE JAN. 1, 1949
- ► HUNTING LICENSE, MEAT PROCESSING, MEAT SHIPPING AND TAXIDERMY WORK/SHIPPING ARE <u>NOT</u> INCLUDED IN THE PRICE OF YOUR HUNT
- ➤ Guide and Cook gratuity is not included in the price of your hunt, and they greatly appreciate gratuity at the hunters own discretion. If they did a great job please let them know! If not, please let us know!
- > We will pick you up at the Eagle Vail or Grand Junction Airports if needed.
